Introduction

Discuss the term 'One good turn deserves another'.

When has helping someone meant that something nice has happened to you in return?

A long, long time ago, in Roman times, a poor slave called Androcles runs away from his master. He finds a cave to sleep in but the cave is a lion's den. Androcles helps the lion and they become friends. After a while, Androcles decides to go back to his home. But he is thrown into prison by his master and made to fight lions in a lion pit (explain what a lion pit is like).

What will happen to Androcles now?

A strange thing happened next.


The lion opened his mighty jaws,
