





Speed sounds

Consonants Say the pure sounds (do not add 'uh').



Vowels Say the sounds in and out of order.

Read in Fred Talk (pure sounds).

Read in syllables.

Sa<u>ll</u>`y → Sa<u>ll</u>y

Fluff y→Fluffy Hiss y →Hissy

Hett'y → Hetty

pupp`y → puppy

The rag doll is Hissy Hetty (long legs like spaghetti).







The puppy dog is Spot
