Do you imagine horrible things?

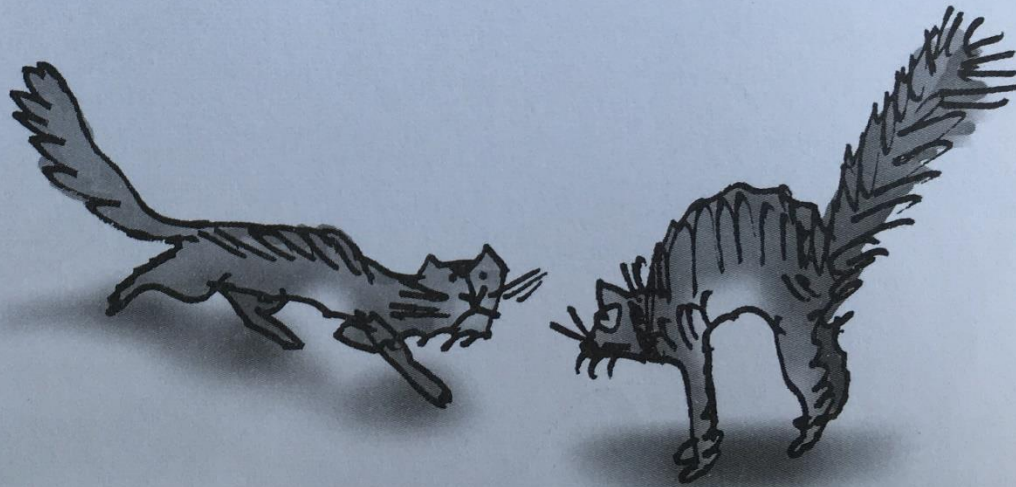
Do you hear horrible things?

Page 11:	FIND IT	What does he worry about seeing in the night?
Page 11:	FIND IT	What does he hear at night?
Page 11:	FIND IT	What does he want someone to do?
Page 12:	PROVE IT	What makes him feel better?
