- to help look after these children


For every £15.90, the charity will feed one child for a WHOLE YEAR!!! Mary's Meals is now reaching 1,101,206 children with a daily meal across four continents.

The Chaplains are encouraging all the children in the school during Lent to give

up something that they normally enjoy but would be happy to give up i.e. a chocolate bar, sweets, etc. & instead of buying these, to donate the money saved to Mary's Meals.
